




- 1. Client rings for advice/ quote
- 2. Talk to client
- 3. Confirm instruction and T & Cs
- 4. Gather available information
- 5. Inspect property
- 6. Prepare Schedule of Condition or Dilapidations report
- 7. Advise and agree way forward with your client
- 8. Meet other surveyor
- 9. Negotiate and agree
- 10. Negotiate and Disagree and ADR or go to court




Party Wall Process

- 1. Client rings for advice/ quote
- 2. Talk to client explain your PW role BO or AO
- 3. Confirm instruction and T & Cs
- 4. Gather available information, drawings, specification
- 5. Inspect property use site notes and use PW flow charts
- 6. Talk to other PW surveyor or appoint one
- 7. Agree a Third Surveyor assuming your not the agreed surveyor
- 8. Meet other surveyor
- 9. Negotiate and agree produce notice use PW flow chart
- 10. Negotiate and Disagree and refer to Third Surveyor or ADR or court
- 11. Monitor work to ensure as agreed and 8 to 11 until completed

- 1. Client rings for advice/ quote
- 2. Talk to client
- 3. Confirm instruction and T & Cs
- 4. Gather available information
- 5. Inspect property / carry out work
- 6. Difference of opinion with other side
- 7. Advise and agree way forward with your client
- 8. Still no agreement
- Negotiate and Disagree use ADR or go to court






